by Lisa Kahn Schnell Illustrated by Alan Marks


Horseshoe crabs, shorebirds, and humans converge in a frenzy of activity.

by Gerda Raidt and Christa Holtei


A mid-nineteenth-century immigration story, with a twist.





A moment-in-the-life biography of Sierra Club founder John Muir.




A young woman challenges the rules and refuses to give up.
