




Every web has a spider sitting at the centre of it.


# A passionate love story about how the Second World War changed women's lives for ever

# Thus Bad Begins Javier Marías


# A young man is drawn into the melancholic, unforgiving world of his employers, where marriages are haunted by past crimes and the truth is far crueller than deception

As a young man, Juan de Vere takes a job that will haunt him for the rest of his life. Eduardo Muriel is a famous film director: charming, discreet, honourable. Muriel's wife Beatriz is a soft, ripe woman who slips through her husband's home like an unwanted ghost, finding solace in other beds. And on the periphery of all their lives stands Dr Jorge Van Vechten, a shadowy family friend implicated in unsavoury rumours - rumours Muriel asks his new assistant Juan to investigate. But as Juan draws closer to the truth, he begins to ask questions of his own. Why does Muriel hate Beatriz? How did Beatriz meet Van Vechten? And what happened during the war?

As Juan learns more about his employers, he begins to understand the conflicting pulls of desire, power and guilt that govern their lives - and his own. Marias presents a study of the infinitely permeable boundaries between private and public selves, between observer and participant, between the deceptions we suffer from others and those we enact upon ourselves.

Javier Marías was born in Madrid in 1951. He has published thirteen novels, two collections of short stories and several volumes of essays. His work has been translated into forty-two languages and won a dazzling array of international literary awards.

Two strangers arrive in a small Spanish fishing village. The older woman is suffering from mysterious paralysis, driven to seek a cure beyond the bounds of conventional medicine. Her daughter Sofia has spent years playing the reluctant detective in this mystery, struggling to understand her mother's illness.

Surrounded by the oppressive desert heat, searching for a cure to a defiant and quite possibly imagined disease, Sofia is forced to confront her difficult relationship with her mother. Deborah Levy explores female rage and sexuality and the ways in which children and parents are both debtors and creditors.

Deborah Levy writes fiction, plays and poetry. Her work has been staged by the Royal Shakespeare Company, and she is the author of numerous highly praised books including *Things I Don't Want to Know* and *The Unloved*, both of which are now available from Penguin. Her novel *Swimming Home* was shortlisted for the 2012 Man Booker Prize, 2012 Specsavers National Book Awards (UK Author of the Year) and the 2013 Jewish Quarterly Wingate Prize.

# Being a good mother is doing the right thing. But sometimes the right thing is not so clear.


When Alice's husband Ben dies suddenly, her world falls apart. They shared twenty years and two daughters and life without him is unimaginable.
