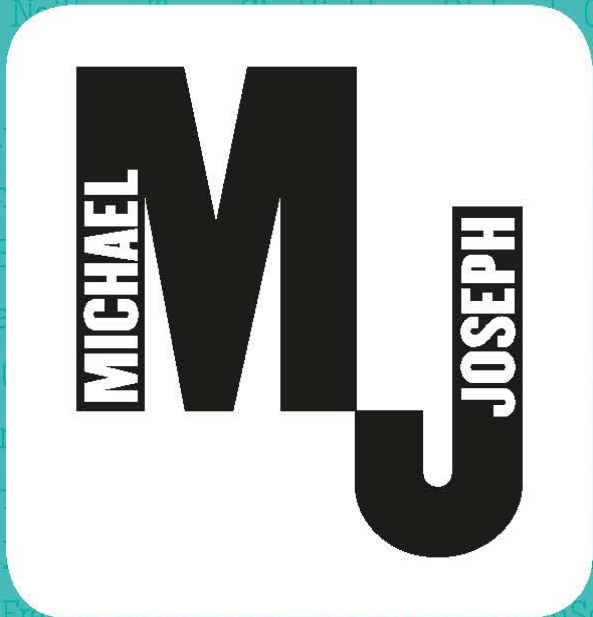

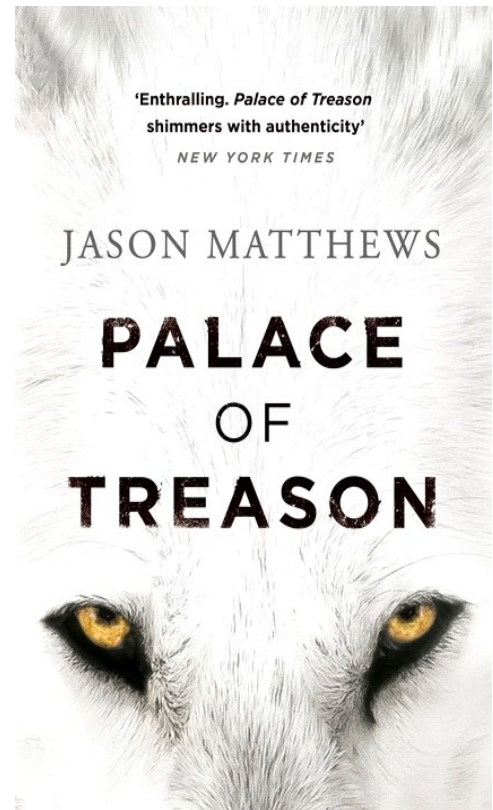

Captain Dominika Egorova of the Russian Intelligence Service has returned to Moscow. She despises the men she serves, the oligarchs, crooks and thugs of Putin's Russia. What no one knows is that Dominika works for the CIA as Washington's most sensitive penetration of the Kremlin.

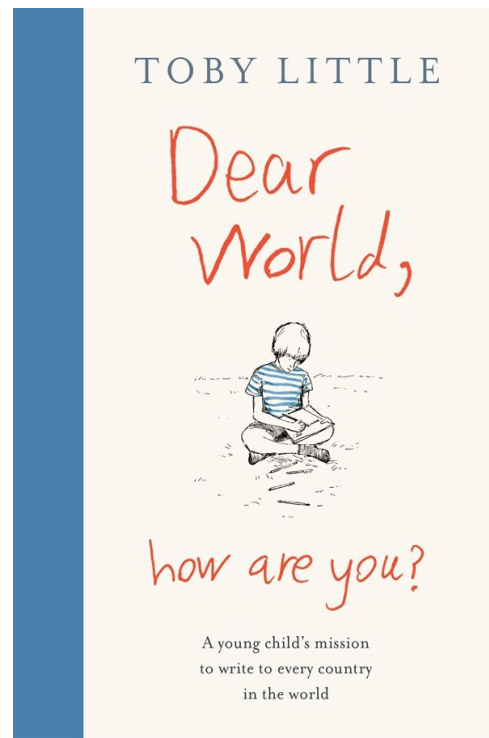
Dear World, How Are You?

Two years ago, seven-year-old Toby decided he'd like to write to someone in every country, to find out more about the world we live in. With his mum's encouragement, he set about hand-writing letters to research scientists in Antarctica, game-keepers in Chad and to a very famous South African president . . . Nearly everyone he wrote to responded, sometimes sending photos, recipes or drawings, telling Toby a little about where they lived - how they lived, what food they ate, what school was like, and, importantly for Toby (as someone very interested in dinosaurs), whether there were fossils in their country.
