


The Italians John Hooper




To Explain the World

In *To Explain the World*, pre-eminent theoretical physicist Steven Weinberg offers a rich and irreverent history of science from a unique perspective - that of a scientist. Moving from ancient Miletus to medieval Baghdad to Oxford, and from the Museum of Alexandria to the Royal Society of London, he shows that the scientists of the past not only did not understand what we understand about the world - they did not understand what there *is* to understand. Yet eventually, through the struggle to solve such mysteries as the backward movement of the planets and the rise and fall of tides, the modern discipline of science emerged.

A long-time contributor to the New York Review of Books, he is the author of The First Three Minutes and Dreams of a Final Theory, among other books. He holds the Josey Regental Chair in Science at the University of Texas at Austin.



For some four centuries the Ottoman Empire had been one of the most powerful states in Europe as well as ruler of the Middle East. Following the Ottoman decision to join the First World War on the side of the Central Powers, the British, French and Russians hatched a plan to finish the Ottomans off: an ambitious and unprecedented invasion of Gallipoli . . .

Eugene Rogan's remarkable new book recreates one of the most important but poorly understood fronts of the First World War. Despite fighting back with great skill and ferocity against the Allied onslaught and humiliating the British both at Gallipoli and in Mesopotamia (Iraq), the Ottomans were ultimately defeated, clearing the way for the making, for better or worse, of a new Middle East which has endured to the present.

Eugene Rogan is the author of the bestselling *The Arabs.* He is University Lecturer in the History of the Modern Middle East at the University of Oxford and a Fellow of St Antony's College.

A Short Enquiry into Human Freedom


John Gray

In *The Soul of the Marionette*, John Gray draws together the religious, philosophic and fantastical traditions that question the very idea of human freedom. We flatter ourselves about the nature of free will and yet the most enormous forces - biological, physical, metaphysical - constrain our every action. Many writers and intellectuals have always understood this, but instead of embracing our condition we battle against it, with everyone from world conquerors to modern scientists dreaming of a 'human dominion' almost comically at odds with our true state.


A Life

The definitive biography of ancient Rome's most powerful and colourful philosopher-politician

This book traces the eventful life of Seneca, the Roman philosopher, dramatist, essayist and rhetorician of the first century CE, who came from Spain to Rome, spent his youth in Egypt, was exiled to Corsica under Claudius but recalled after eight years, and rose to dizzying heights of wealth, power and social influence under Nero, before falling from favour and being forced to kill himself. The book analyzes the relationship of Seneca's life story to his literary self-fashioning, and the tensions between the external worlds of politics, consumerism, and social success, with the Stoic ideals of asceticism, virtue and self-control.

Emily Wilson is an Associate Professor in the Department of Classical Studies. She has a BA from Oxford in Classics, an MPhil, also from Oxford, in English Literature (1500-1660), and a PhD from Yale in Classics and Comparative Literature. Her first book was *Mocked with Death: Tragic Overliving from Sophocles to Milton*. Her second book was *The Death of Sophocles: Hero, Villain, Chatterbox, Saint*.



In cultures that champion the individual, guilt is seen as the cornerstone of conscience yet it proves impotent in the face of corrupt corporate policies. Jennifer Jacquet persuasively argues that modern-day shaming is a non-violent form of resistance that can be used to bring about large-scale change. Shaming, Jacquet shows, works best when used sparingly, but when applied in just the right way and at just the right time, it can keep us from failing ourselves.

Jennifer Jacquet is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Environmental Studies at New York University. She works at the intersection of conservation and cooperation. 



Octavian was a young soldier training abroad when he heard news of Julius Caesar's brutal assassination - and discovered that he was the dictator's sole political heir. With the opportunism and instinct for propaganda that were to characterize his rule, Octavian rallied huge financial, military and political backing to take autocratic control of a state devoted to Republicanism. He become Augustus - Rome's first Emperor and founder of the greatest empire the world had ever seen.

In this monumental biography, translated into English by Anthea Bell, Jochen Bleicken tells the story of the man who found himself a demi-god in his own lifetime.

Jochen Bleicken was born in 1926 on the island of Sylt in Germany. He studied History and Classical Philology at the universities of Kiel and Frankfurt from 1948 to 1954 before going on to work as a Professor of History at Hamburg, Frankfurt and Göttingen. In 1978, he was made a member of the Göttingen Academy of Sciences. He retired in 1991, but continued to give lectures for years thereafter, finally stopping in 1999. He died in 2005.



While economists often turn to measures like GDP or percapita income, Cesar Hidalgo turns to information theory to explain the success or failure of a country's economic performance. Through a radical rethinking of what the economy *is*, Hidalgo shows that natural constraints in our ability to accumulate knowledge, knowhow and information explain the evolution of social and economic complexity. This is a rare tour de force, linking economics, sociology, physics, biology and information theory, to explain the evolution of social and economic systems as a consequence of the physical embodiment of information in a world where knowledge is quite literally power.



Why are the French an exceptional nation? Why do they think they are so exceptional? The Russian decision to mobilize in July 1914 may have been the single most catastrophic choice of the modern era. 

He has been living under police protection since October 2006, following threats received from the criminal organizations that he denounced. The Brunis and the Brutis

Knights, Corsairs, Jesuits and Spies in the Sixteenth-Century Mediterranean World

Noel Malcolm

The sixteenth-century Mediterranean seen through the extraordinary history of a family, uncovered by one of Britain's most original scholars

Beginning with an archival discovery worthy of a Borges story, *The Brunis and the Brutis* describes the paths taken through the eastern Mediterranean and its hinterland by an eminent Venetian-Albanian family - amongst them an archbishop in the Balkans, the captain of the papal flagship at Lepanto, the power behind the throne in the Ottoman province of Moldavia, a dragoman (interpreter) at the Porte - previously almost invisible to history. Through them, Noel Malcolm casts the world between Venice and Istanbul in a fresh light, illuminating subjects as diverse as espionage, slaveransoming and the grain trade. It is a masterpiece of both scholarship and storytelling, creating a panoramic picture of interrelations between the Christian and Ottoman worlds.

Noel Malcolm, a Senior Research Fellow at All Souls College, Oxford, has previously written histories of Bosnia (1994) and Kosovo (1998). He is a general editor of the Clarendon edition of Thomas Hobbes, for which he himself has produced acclaimed editions of Hobbes's letters (1994) and *Leviathan* (2012). He is also a former foreign editor of the *Spectator*. He was knighted in 2014.


